


Self-Employment Income Support Scheme (SEISS) scam

We have been made aware of a scam targeting the Self-Employment Income Support Scheme.

What happens:

- You receive a message claiming to be from HM Revenue and Customs
- They request personal information such as Passport or Driving License to obtain an 'SEISS tax refund'.



What to do:

- This is a scam.
- Forward text messages free of charge to 7729 and then delete.
- For advice or to report, contact <u>Citizens Advice Scams Action</u>
- If you're unsure whether it is HMRC, use the checklist to decide if the contact is genuine.

End of partnership with Checkatrade

Last year, we notified Kent tradespeople that the Trading Standards partnership with Checkatrade would end in March 2021 and that we launched our own <u>Trading Standards Checked</u> scheme in early 2020. We continued to work with Checkatrade until all memberships had completed on 31 March this year, and now Trading Standards Checked is the **only** place to find trader that's checked and vetted by Kent County Council Trading Standards.

The Trading Standards Approved logo is no longer valid and traders displaying it are breaking the law.












Upcoming Events in May





Locals to have a say on Sevenoaks sculptures



Residents are being asked for their views on two proposed sculptures for Bligh's in Sevenoaks.

The Council's Public Realm Commission is working with the art community and others to place a piece of public art outside of M&S.

Last year, artists were invited to come forward with their ideas for the busy Sevenoaks site and the Council received more than 35 submissions.

These were shortlisted down to two entries with the help of local artists, businesses and residents.

The first is 'Three and Four' by Oliver Barratt, a bronze statue inspired by coppice trees and hop vines that once grew locally. The statue's verdant green-base is a reference to the green buses that came and went through Bligh's when it was a bus station.

The other is 'Seven Oaks' by Simone Tchonova and Matthijs le Roi. The sculpture represents the oaks of Sevenoaks and is symbolic of climate restoration. Residents would be invited to have their own personal environmental message engraved on one of the 4,500 unique steel pieces that form part of the sculpture.

The survey will remain open until **5pm on Friday 14 May**.

Cllr Roddy Hogarth, the Council's Commissioner of the Public Realm, says: "We are excited to be bringing public art to such a well-used location, right in the heart of Sevenoaks town.

"The past year has shown us that outdoor spaces are incredibly important so now, more than ever, we want to make the most of our public areas.

"We have shortlisted two outstanding options for the site. We would love to know what residents think of these proposals, so we would urge them to visit our website to find out more and have their say."
