Congratulations to Sevenoaks Bookshop, Crowned 'Independent Bookshop of the Year'

Kent's Sevenoaks Bookshop, the South-east England category winner, takes the overall prize. The store is now well into its eighth decade, but it won't have faced a year as tough as 2020. Its small but indefatigable team responded to the challenges of lockdowns, moving to web, phone and e-mail orders during months of closure and dispatching around 3,500 books to loyal customers—many of them personally delivered by foot and bike. Click-and-collect and Bookshop.org added more sales channels. Events moved online too, including book clubs on Facebook and author events on Zoom.

The tumultuous year showed how this, and other independent bookshops sit at the heart of their communities' cultural and social lives. Somehow, Sevenoaks Bookshop ended 2020 in sales growth, having not furloughed a single bookseller. It also emerged into 2021 twice the size it was before the pandemic, having taken over adjacent premises and launched a dedicated children's area—a sign of great confidence for the future.

"I'm full of praise and wonder for Sevenoaks' team," said one British Book Awards judge. "It's easy to forget how scary things were at the start of the pandemic, and the creativity and fortitude they have shown is amazing," said another. "To expand at a time when the high street is hunkering down is astounding... the love and enthusiasm for books shines through and inspires us all."

Congratulations to the Sevenoaks Bookshop team.

Latest updates for businesses affected by COVID-19

The <u>heritage locations guidance</u> has been updated for Step 3 of the roadmap (from 17 May). Please see some key information below:

From 17 May, the following will apply.

Heritage locations can open to the public.

- This applies to indoor and outdoor heritage locations including stately and historic homes and castles, historic parks, gardens, landscapes, ruins and monuments. Locations can open indoor and outdoor facilities, including visitor centres.
- Guests can visit these locations in line with the legal gathering limits.
 Outdoors, people can only gather in groups of up to 30 people (unless
 an exemption applies). Indoors, people can only meet in groups of up to
 6 people, or as a group of 2 households/bubbles (unless an exemption
 applies). Social distancing should be maintained between people who do
 not live together or share a bubble.

Indoor and outdoor activities and guided tours are permitted, but must operate within the legal gathering limits.

- Activities and tours can be provided for a single permitted group of visitors (up to 30 people outdoors, or up to 6 people or 2 households/bubbles indoors, unless exemptions apply).
- Activities and tours can also be provided for multiple groups, provided that the organiser takes the required precautions and groups are kept separate throughout the activity or tour. Each group must adhere to the legal gathering limits (up to 30 people outdoors, or up to 6 people or 2 households/bubbles indoors, unless exemptions apply).

The rules on meetings and events will change:

 Indoor and outdoor events can take place, with COVID-secure measures and capacity limits in place. This includes business events such as conferences, trade shows, exhibitions, charity auctions, private dining

- events such as charity or gala dinners and awards ceremonies, and corporate hospitality. Events permitted from Step 3 should follow all COVID-secure guidance, adhere to all legal requirements, and take all reasonable action to mitigate risk to public health. Capacity restrictions will apply to both indoor and outdoor events.
- In-person meetings can take place when reasonably necessary.
 However, businesses should not hold meetings for the purposes of gathering staff if they are not necessary. Business show-rounds, viewings and site visits can take place at heritage locations.
- Weddings/civil partnerships, funerals and other life events can take
 place, however restrictions will apply to some types of event. Wedding
 show-rounds, viewings and site visits can take place at heritage
 locations. You should check the guidance on <u>wedding and civil</u>
 <u>partnership receptions and celebrations</u> and <u>funerals</u> and ensure
 you follow any relevant measures.
- Further guidance can be found in the <u>section on meetings and events</u>, the <u>guidance for visitor economy settings</u> and the <u>organised events</u> guidance for local authorities.

Hospitality:

- Hospitality venues such as restaurants, cafes and bars can open to the
 public for indoor and outdoor service (and can continue to offer
 takeaway food and drinks). Restrictions apply, including measures on
 table sizes and how customers are served.
- You can find more information in the <u>section on changes to facilities</u> <u>and services</u> and the <u>guidance for restaurants</u>, <u>pubs</u>, <u>bars and</u> <u>takeaway services</u>, and ensure you adhere to any relevant measures.

Visitor attractions and recreational venues:

 Visitor attractions and recreational venues can open both indoor and outdoor areas. You can find more information in the <u>guidance for</u> <u>visitor economy settings</u>.



FAQ

What is Go2 direct?

A more personalised door to door service.

Does go2 direct replace bus routes or Go2?

No, this is a new service designed to complement the existing network.

Will I still share my ride?

No- Go2 direct is private for you and up to 6 friends.

How do I book?

For the best experience we recommend using the Go2 Sevenoaks App, but you can still book by telephone.

What's different about Go2 direct?

Private, door to door, pre-bookable, premium service.

Use the App or pay the Driver directly by cash.

How much does it cost?

More than Go2 but less than a conventional Taxi.

Where can I travel?

Anywhere in the Sevenoaks District.

When can I travel?

Monday to Friday 06:00 - 19:30 and Saturday 07:00 - 18:30.

What if I am a wheelchair user?

All Go2 Direct vehicles have the capacity to take 1 wheelchair user and up to 5 friends.

Can I take luggage with me?

Yes, all vehicles have ample storage space.

Can I book in advance?

Yes, bookings can be made up to 28 days in advance.

Is there a local booking point?

Yes, bookings can be made at Sevenoaks Bus Station in the Travel Office between 10:00 and 15:00 Monday-Friday.

Are there any extra costs?

No, the price you see is the price you pay. No extra cost for traffic delays, luggage, pets etc.

Do I get a discount with my concessionary Pass?

Yes, 20% discount off the full fare.
